The Kohima Museum in York, UK was officially opened in 1991. It was formed from the ad-noc collection of artefacts and memorabilia donated to the

The museum has developed since then and is accredited under the Arts Council of England (ACE). In addition, the museum is the only museum in the whole country that provides a focused and detailed window to the Burma Campaign of WW2 including the renowned Chindits of Major General Orde Wingate. We display the medals and equipment used by both sides including personal and operational accounts. Visitors to the museum can get a detailed presentation of the Siege and the battle of Kohima Ridge that was one of the major turning points of the war against the Japanese.
